# Modals (2) How can we make questions about ability?

- Modal verbs are helping/auxiliary verbs that express ideas like **ability**, permission, possibility, and necessity. Many modal verbs have more than one meaning. They are always followed by the simple form of a verb.
- Modal auxiliary + subject + main verb + ... ?
  - **Can** she play guitar?
  - **Could** you speak English Before this program?
  - **Can** we stay in contact?



# Modals (2) How can we make questions about ability?

- BE + subject + able to + main verb + ... ?
  - Are you **able to** understand the lesson?
  - Were you **able to** finish the test?
  - Was he **able to** pass the exam?
- Notice that we **do not need** the verbs “do/does/did” when we make questions!
